



PROPHECY IN THE OLD TESTAMENT

- Prophets hear from God & share it.
- God told the prophets the same things:
 - sin separates people from God
 - stop sinning and obey God
 - the people couldn't stop sinning
 - God promised to send a **rescuer**



PROPHECY IN THE NEW TESTAMENT

- Jesus is the ultimate revelation of God.
- After Jesus died, prophets were active in the New Testament church:

Antioch (Acts 11:28, 13:1)

Tyre (Acts 21:4)

Caesarea(Acts 21:8-9)

Rome (Rom 12:6)

Corinth (1 Cor 12:7-11; 14:1-40)

Ephesus (Eph 2:20,4:11; Acts19:1-7; 1 Tim 1:18) Thessalonica (1 Thess 5:19-22)

PROPHECY IN YOUR LIFE

- It is still valid & useful for the church today clear implication from 1 Cor 13:8-12 and Acts 2:17-18.
- Though prophecy is prompted by the Holy Spirit, it is fallible because a modernday prophet's hearing & relaying is imperfect.



How do we respond to prophetic words given to us?

Willingness

Prophecy:

• is not on par with Scripture (1 Cor 2:13, 2 Tim 3:16)

Word of God

- must not contradict Scripture
- can not substitute Scripture


